

First-Year Student Survey in Capsule 2003-2004

This year's survey was conducted through web interface. First-year students were asked to complete the questionnaire when they attended one of the University Workshop sessions.

A total of 1,163 first-year students responded to the Survey, representing a response rate of 80.5% (1,163 out of 1,445), compared with 87.7% of last year. Below is the summary of the data collected.




Like the past few years, the 2003-04 FYFD cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.64(1:1.72 in 2002-03)



The majority of the respondents (78.1%) are aged 20 or below (88.9% in 2002-03).


Religion Status

- F Others


Same as last year, over 65% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, 21.0% of them are Christian/Protestant.

Years of Residence in Hong Kong




An overwhelming majority (86.6%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Less than 2% of the first-year students have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

Number of Family Members




84.7% of the first-year students come from a family with three to five members.


Only 11.5% of fathers and 6.9% of mothers have attained post-secondary-five education.

Monthly Household Income




64.3% of the first-year students have a monthly household income below HK\$20,000.

Distribution of Residence and Average Travelling Time



Resident District




Only 14.4% of the first-year students do not have concern about financing their university education. The most important source of finance for university education still comes from the family, same as last year.

Type of Residence



54.6% of our students live in Government housing schemed flats (Government housing estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). Same as last year, about 40% of their residence has a size ranging from 400 to 599 sq.ft.
