

# New Student Survey in Capsule 2007-2008

This survey is conducted through web interface every year during the University-Life Workshop. First-degree intake students are asked to complete the questionnaire when they attend one of the Workshop sessions.

A total of 1,131 students responded to the Survey, representing a response rate of 72.6% (1,131 out of 1,558), compared with 71.6% of last year. Below is the summary of the data collected.




Like the past few years, the 2007-08 FYFD cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.58 (1:1.81 in 2006-07)




The majority of the respondents (76.3%) are aged 20 or below (84.9% in 2006-07).

### **Religion Status**




Around 67.6% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, 23.1% of them are Christian/Protestant.

#### Years of Residence in Hong Kong




An overwhelming majority (80.3%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Less than 6% of the first-degree intake students have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

#### **Number of Family Members**




86.1% of the first-degree intake students come from a family with three to five members.



Most fathers are skilled/semi-skilled workers (20.9%) or work in the service sector (17.9%) while 40.3% of their mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeeper. 9.9% of the fathers and 3.8% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.




56.8 % of the first-degree intake students have a monthly household income below HK\$20,000.


## **Resident District**

Over 50% of the first-degree intake students (54.6%) live in the New Territories, with a higher portion living in Shatin. The average travelling time (single journey from home to University) for all students is around 53.6 minutes.






Only 21.4% of the first-degree intake students do not have concern about financing their university education. The most important source of finance for university education still comes from the family, same as previous years.

**Type of Residence** 



50.6% of our students live in Government housing schemed flats (Government housing estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 59.1% of their residence has a size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft.
