
New Student Survey in Capsule 2011-2012


This survey is conducted through web interface every year during the University-Life Workshop. First-degree intake students are asked to complete the questionnaire when they attend one of the Workshop sessions.

A total of 1,422 students responded to the Survey, representing a response rate of 86.1% (1,422 out of 1,652), compared with 87.8% of last year. Below is the summary of the data collected.



Academic Year


Like the past few years, the 2011-2012 FYFD cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.66 (1:1.62 in 2010-11)



Age Profile


The majority of the respondents (75.2%) are aged 20 or below (74.9% in 2010-11).

Religion Status




Around 72.4% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, 20.3% of them are Protestant/ Christian.

Years of Residence in Hong Kong





Number of Family Members




86.8% of the first-degree intake students come from a family with three to five members.



Most fathers are skilled/semi-skilled workers (21.8%) or they work in the service sector (17.3%) and others area (19.0%) while 33.5% of their mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeeper. 9.0% of the fathers and 3.7% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.




54.4% of the first-degree intake students have a monthly household income below HK\$20,000.


Resident District

Concern about Financing University Education




Only 26.5% of the first-degree intake students do not have concern about financing their university education. The most important source of finance for university education still comes from the family, same as previous years.
