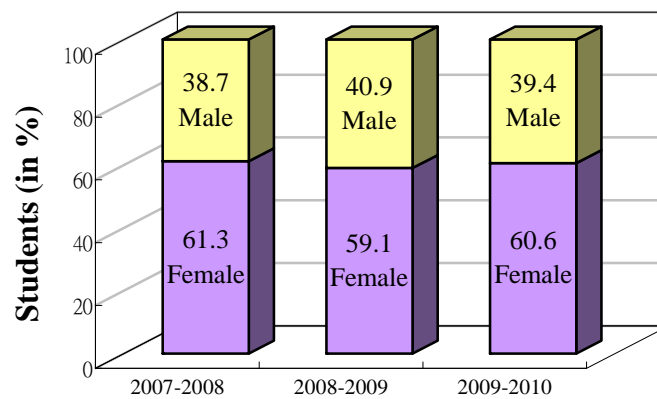


New Student Survey in Capsule 2009-2010

This survey is conducted through web interface every year during the University-Life Workshop. First-degree intake students are asked to complete the questionnaire when they attend one of the Workshop sessions.

A total of 1,462 students responded to the Survey, representing a response rate of 88.3% (1,462 out of 1,655), compared with 82.9% of last year. Below is the summary of the data collected.

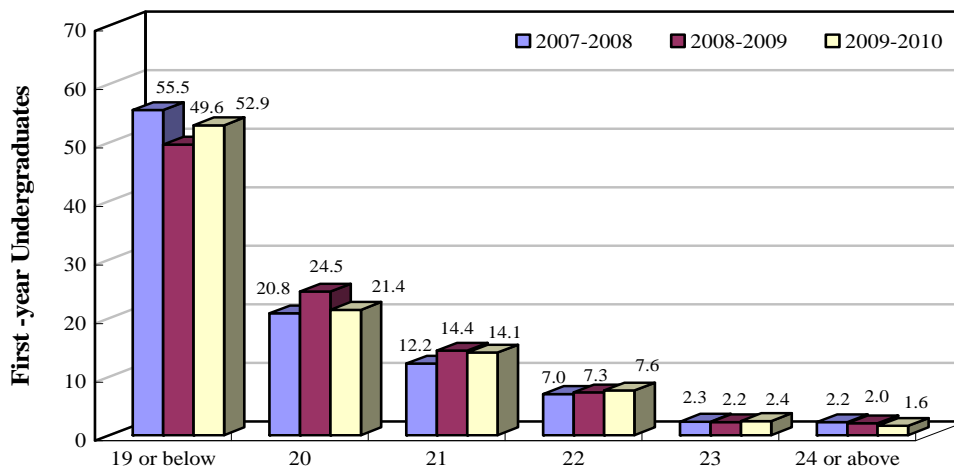
Sex Profile



Academic Year

Like the past few years, the 2009-2010 FYFD cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.54 (1:1.45 in 2008-09)

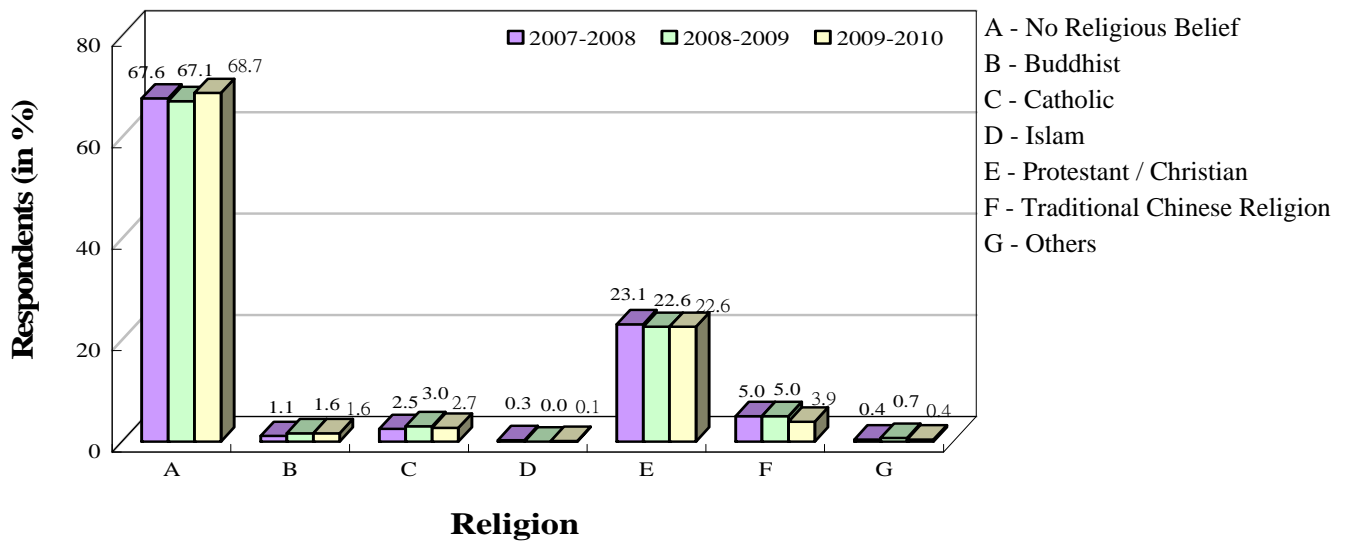
Age Profile



Age

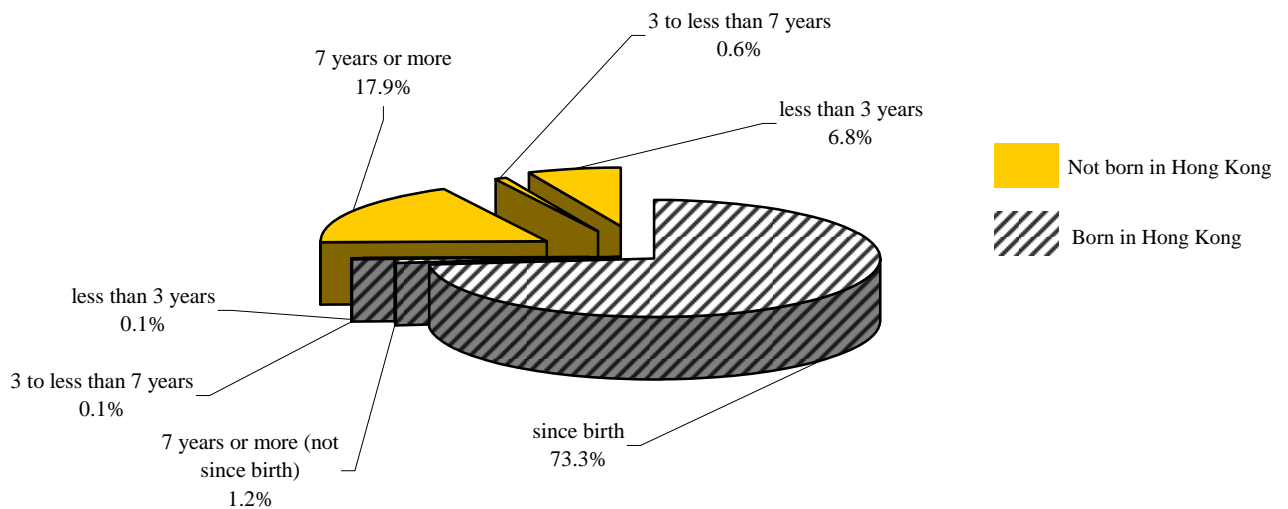
The majority of the respondents (74.3%) are aged 20 or below (74.1% in 2008-09).

Religion Status



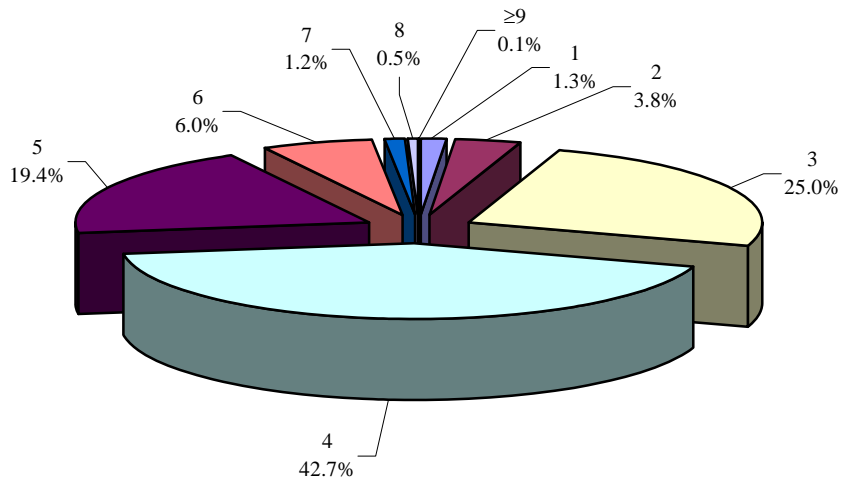
Around 68.7% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, 22.6% of them are Protestant/ Christian.

Years of Residence in Hong Kong



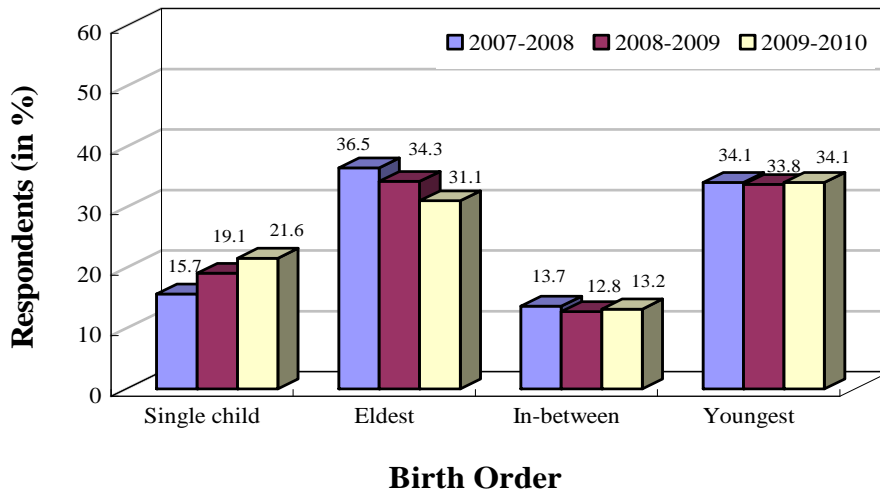
An overwhelming majority (74.7%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Less than 8% of the first-degree intake students have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

Number of Family Members



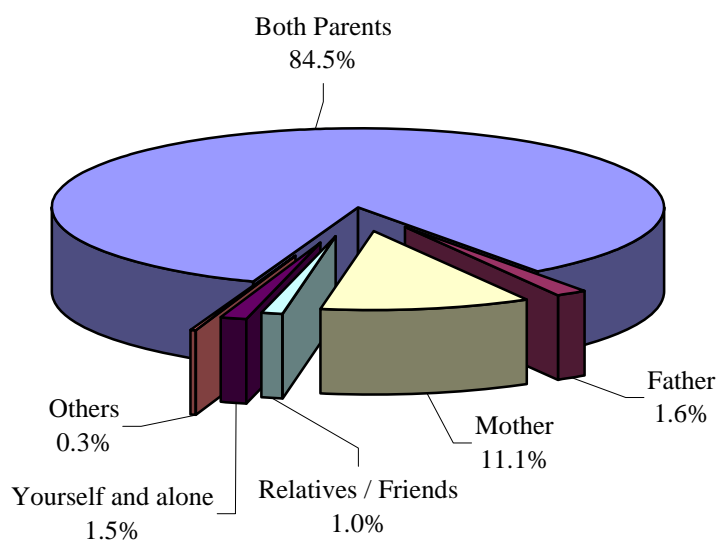
87.1% of the first-degree intake students come from a family with three to five members.

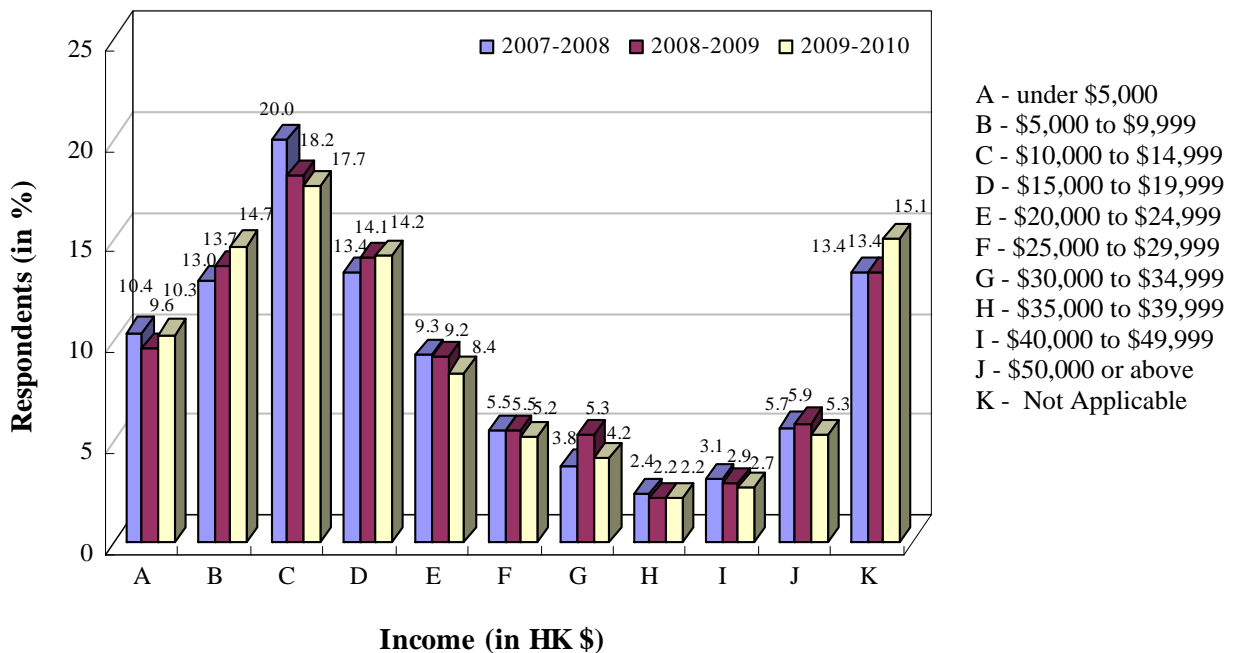
Only 16.3% of fathers and 11.9% of mothers have attained post-secondary/ University education.

Most fathers are skilled/ semi-skilled workers (20.9%) or they work in the service sector (17.6%) and others area (17.6%) while 38.1% of their mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeeper. 9.9% of the fathers and 3.8% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.

Household Income

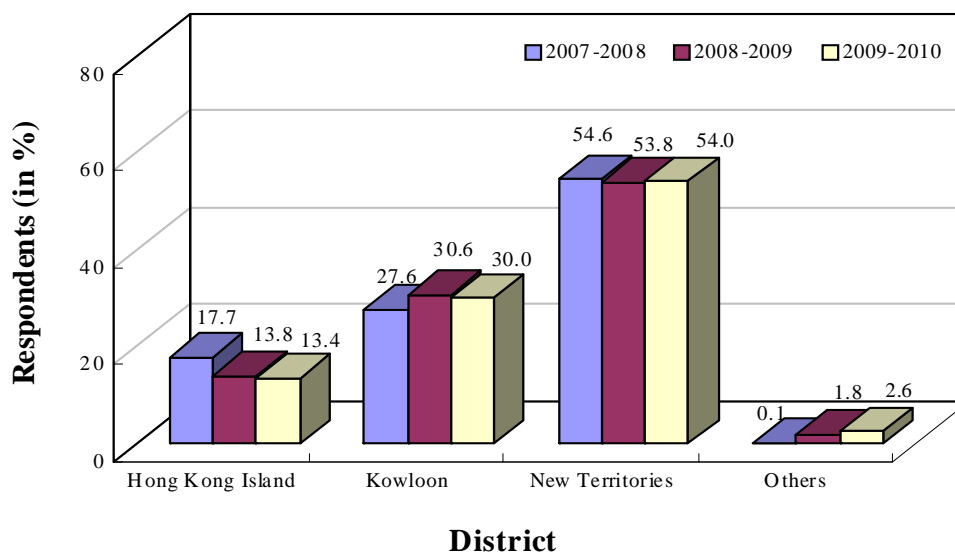


56.9% of the first-degree intake students have a monthly household income below HK\$20,000.

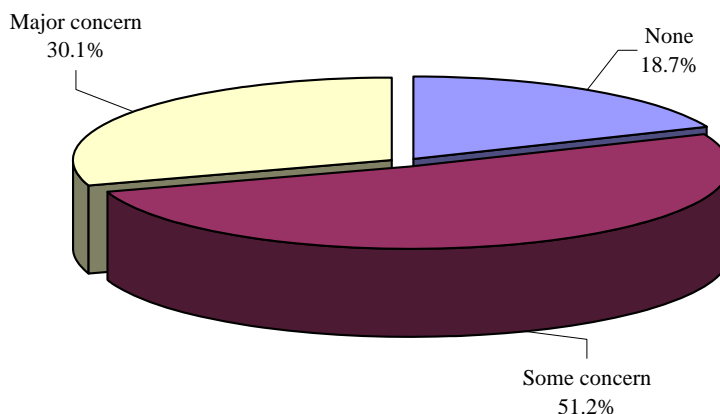

Resident District



54% of the first-degree intake students live in the New Territories, with a higher portion living in Sha Tin. The average travelling time (single journey from home to University) for all students is around 51 minutes.

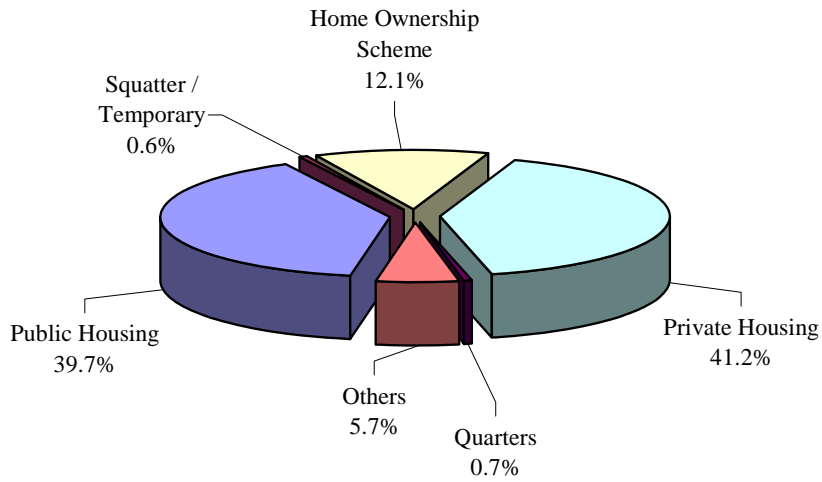

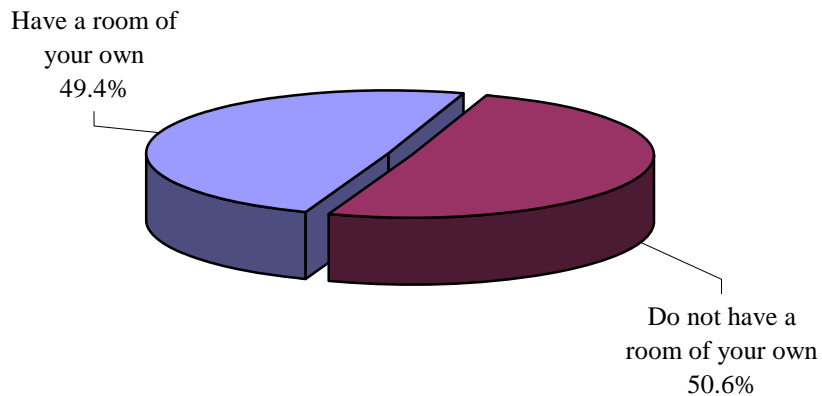
Only 18.7% of the first-degree intake students do not have concern about financing their university education. The most important source of finance for university education still comes from the family, same as previous years.

Type of Residence



51.8% of our students live in Government housing schemed flats (Government Public Housing estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 56.4% of their residence has a size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft.

Study Place at Home



Only 49.4% of the first-degree intake students have their own room.
