
# New Student Survey in Capsule 2014-2015


This survey is conducted when first-degree intake students activate their account. A total of 1,659 students responded to the survey, representing a response rate of 85.5% (1,659 out of 1,941), compared with 92.0% of last year. Below is the summary of the data collected.

#### Sex Profile




Like the past few years, the 2014-15 cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:71 (1:1.99 in 2013-14).

#### Age Profile





Unlike 2012-13, there is only 4-year cohort in 2013-14 and 2014-2015. The percentage of 2014-15 cohort who are aged 20 or below is 82.8% (80.9% in 2013-14).

#### **Religion Status**




66.8% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, 22.7% of them are Protestant / Christian.







# Number of Family Members




87.4% of the first-degree intake students come from a family with three to five members.


Only 16% of fathers and 12.2% of mothers have attained post-secondary / university education.

#### **Household Income**




40.5% of the first-degree intake students have a monthly household income below HK\$20,000.



# **Resident District**



58.6% of the first-degree intake students live in the New Territories, with a higher portion living in Yuen Long and Sha Tin. The average travelling time (single journey from home to University) for all students is 62.1 minutes.




Only 21.5% of the first-degree intake students do not have concern about financing their university education. The most important source of finance for university education still comes from the family, same as previous years.

Type of Residence



53.9% of our students live in Government housing schemed flats (Government Public Housing estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 62% of their residence has a size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft.
