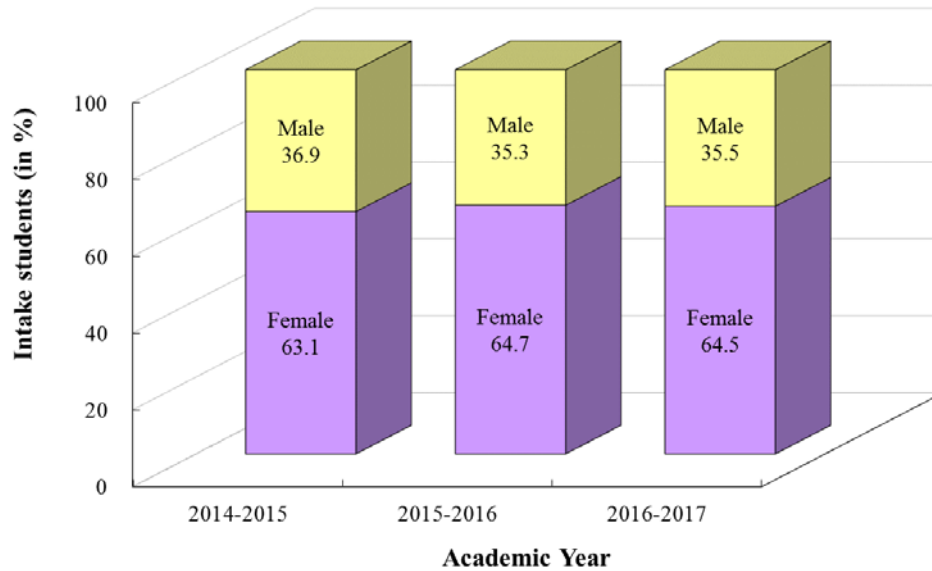


New Student Survey in Capsule 2016-2017

This survey is conducted when local first-degree intake students activate their single-sign-on account. A total of 1,811 students responded to the survey in this year, representing a response rate of 99.6% (1,811 out of 1,818), while that of last year was 99.7%.

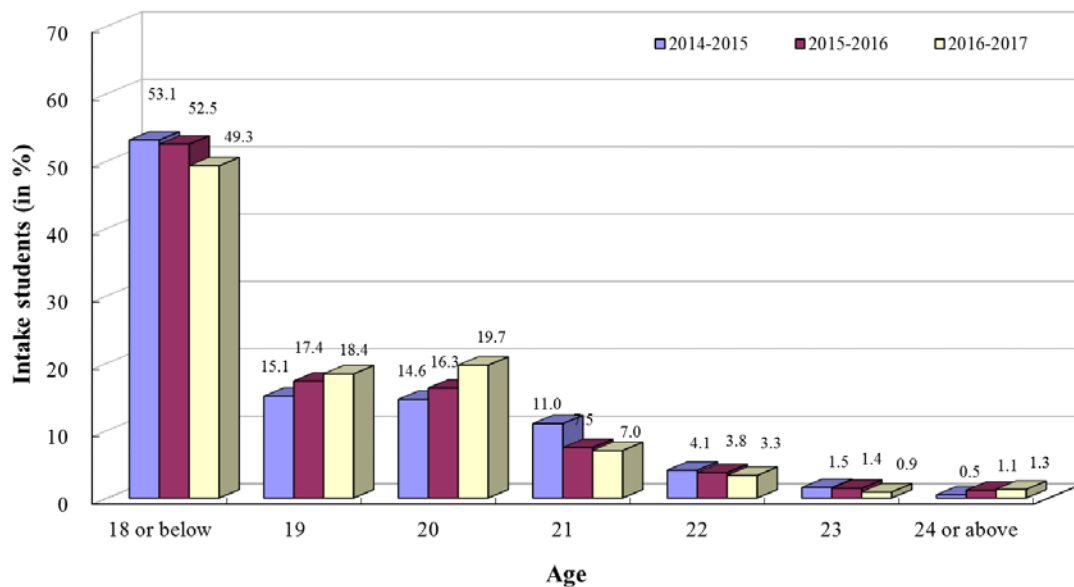
The following is the profile of all first-degree intake students for 2016-17.

Sex Profile



Like the past few years, the 2016-17 cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.82 (1:1.83 in 2015-16).

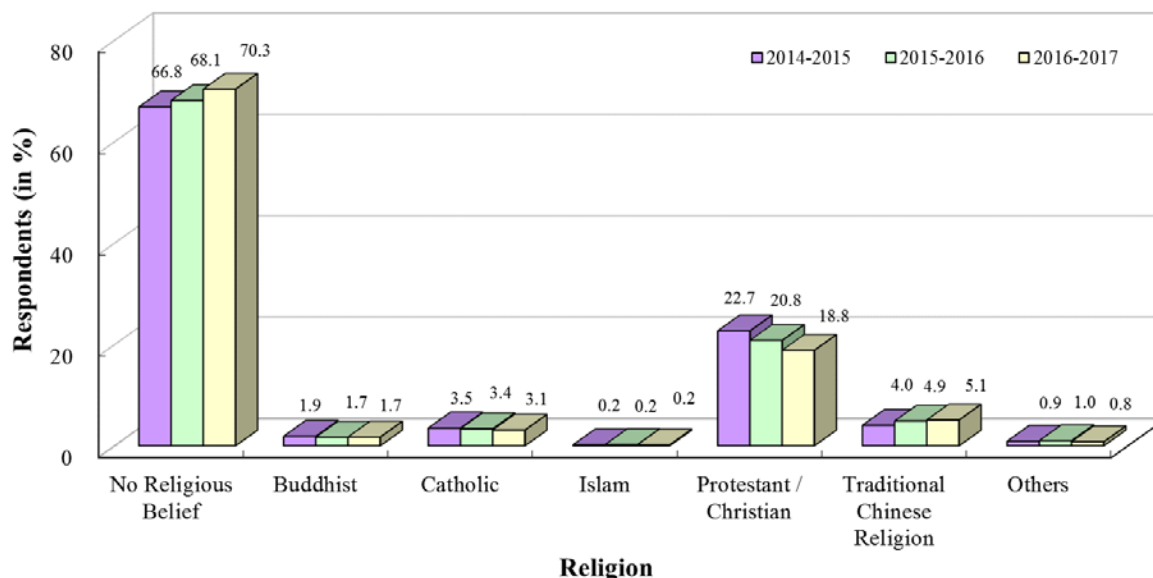
Age Profile



The percentage of 2016-17 cohort with age 20 or below is 87.4% (86.2% in 2015-16).

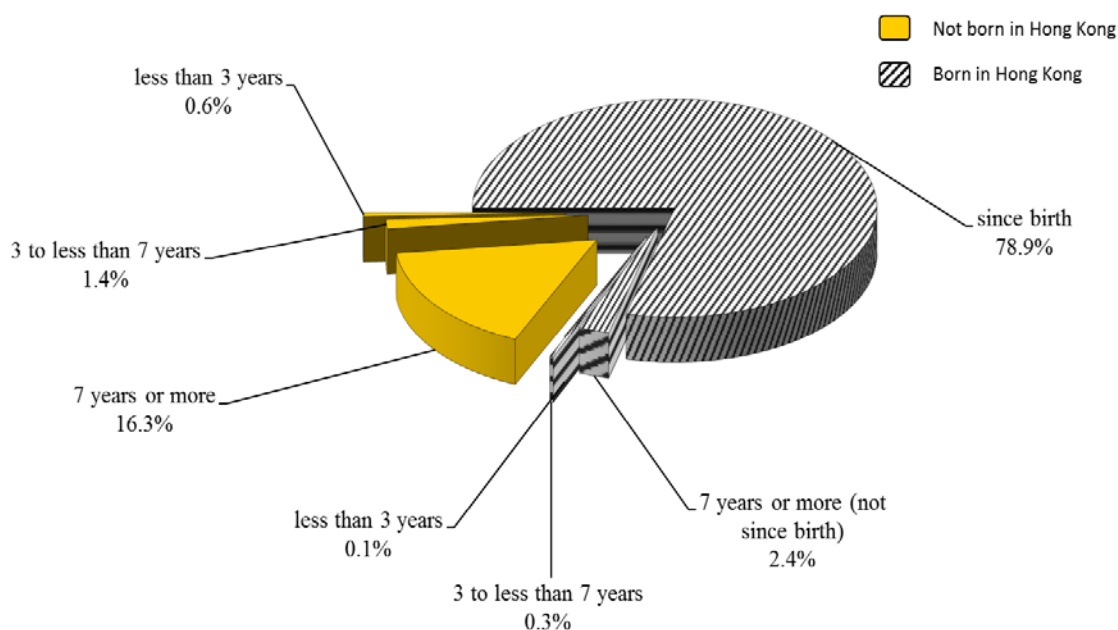
Below is the summary of the data collected from the survey on local first-degree intake students.

Religion Status



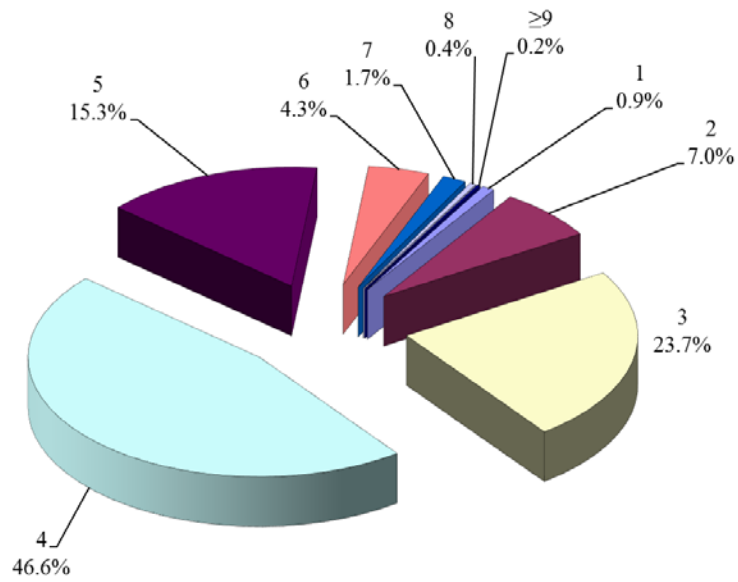
70.3% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, the majority are Protestant / Christian (18.8%).

Years of Residence in Hong Kong



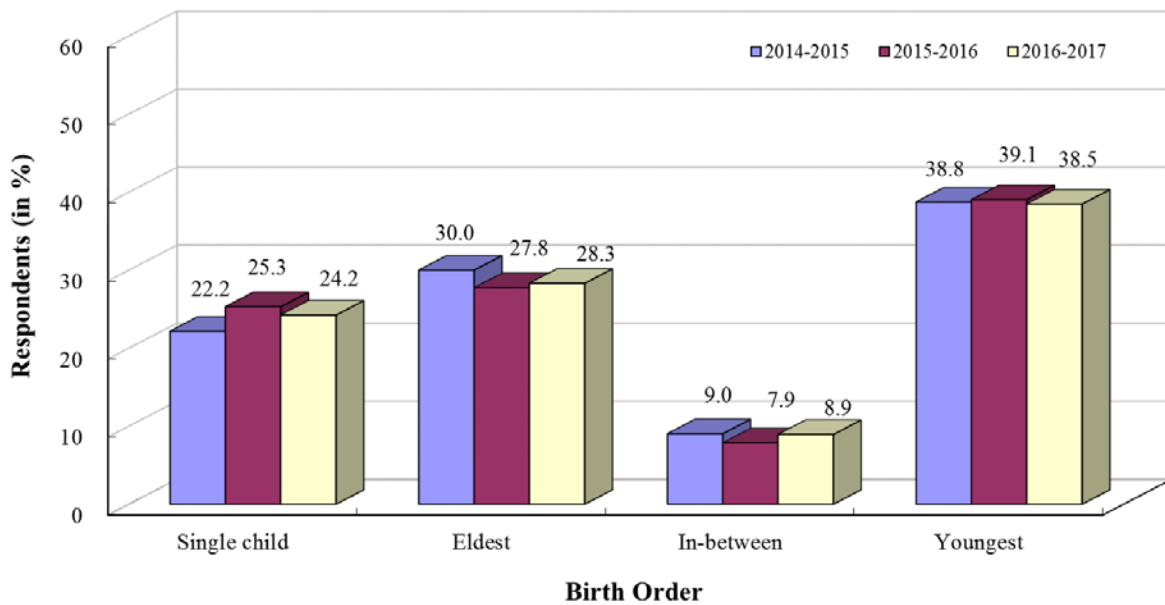
An overwhelming majority (81.6%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Only 2.4% of the respondents have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

Number of Family Members



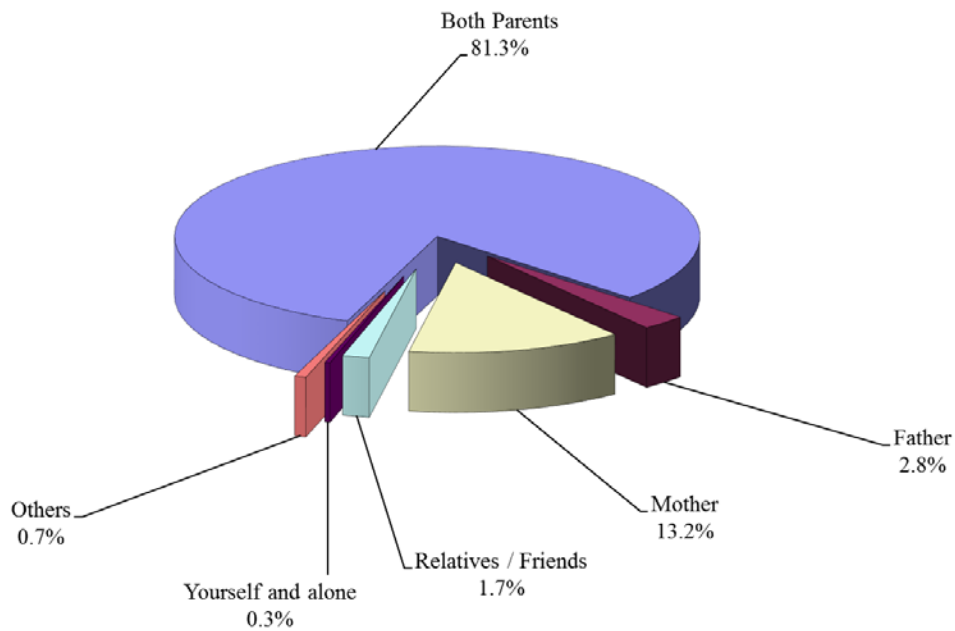
85.6% of the respondents come from a family with three to five members.

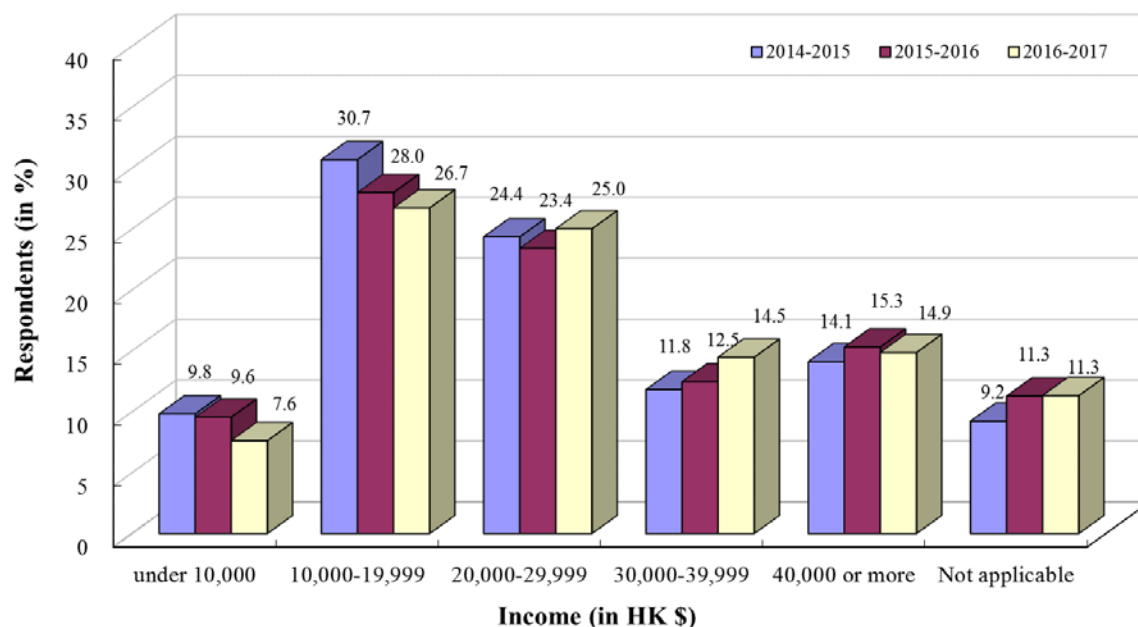
Only 16.8% of fathers and 13.3% of mothers have attained post-secondary / university education.

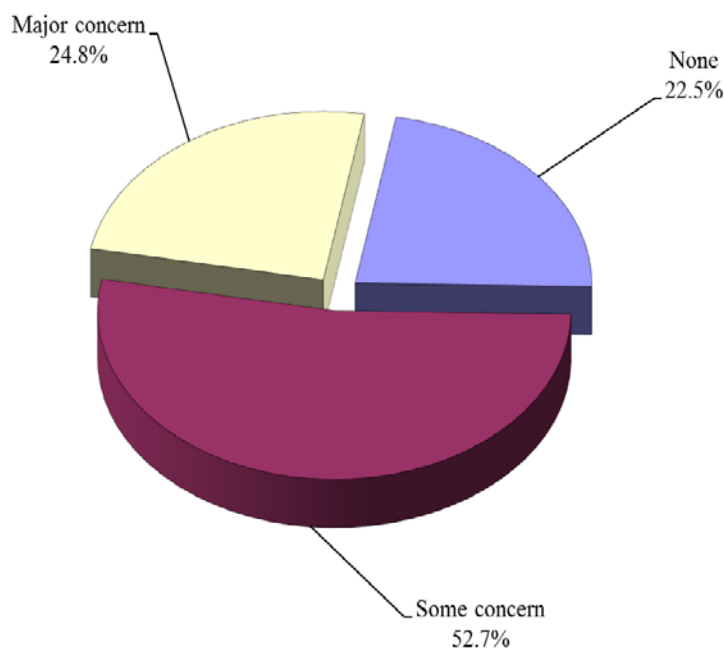
Most of the fathers are skilled / semi-skilled workers (19.3%) or work in the service sector (18.8%) while 29.8% of the mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeepers. 8.6% of the fathers and 3.9% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.

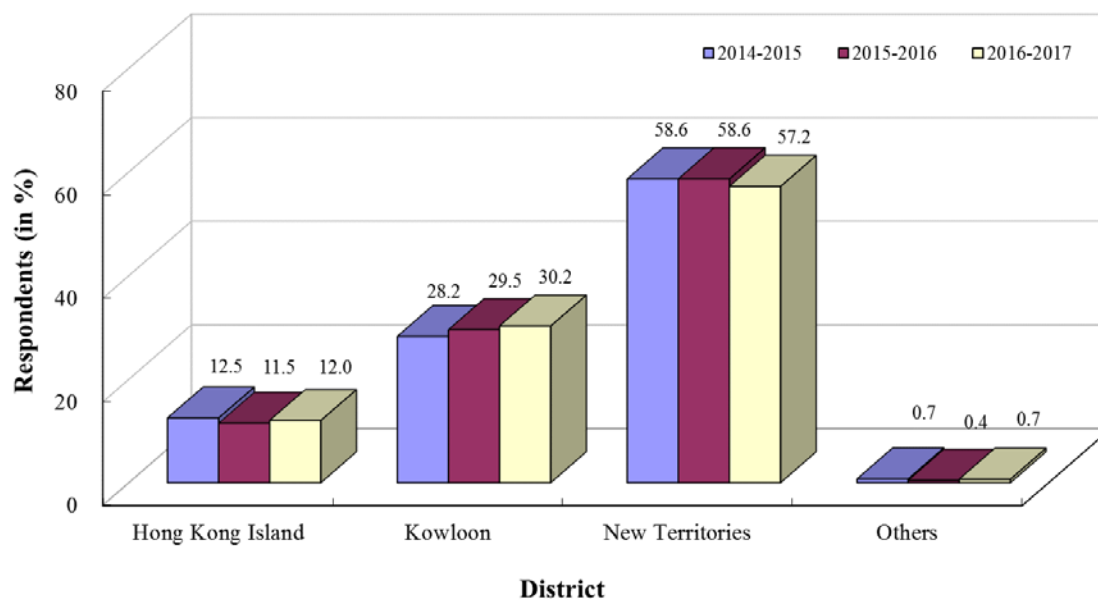

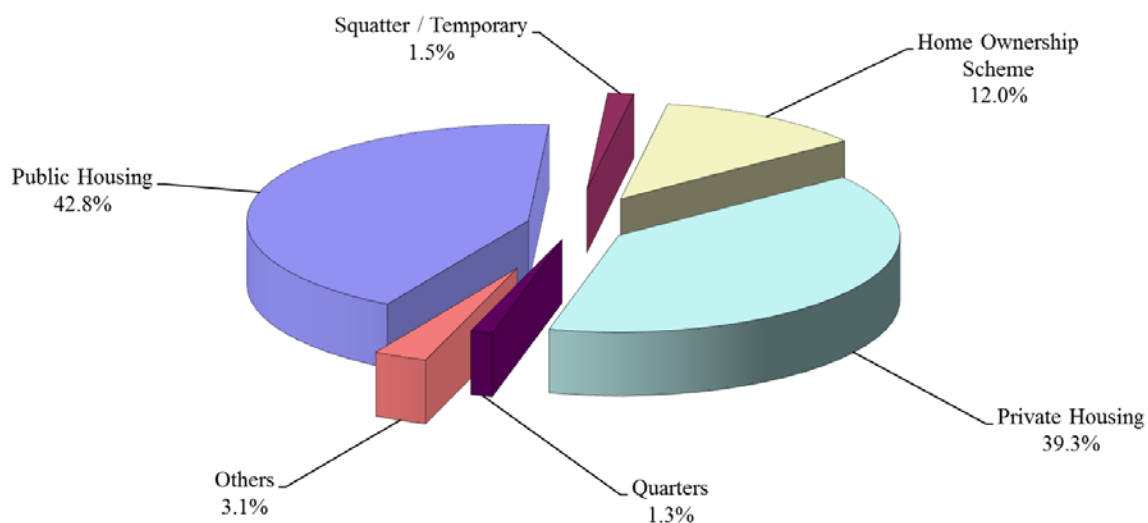

Resident District



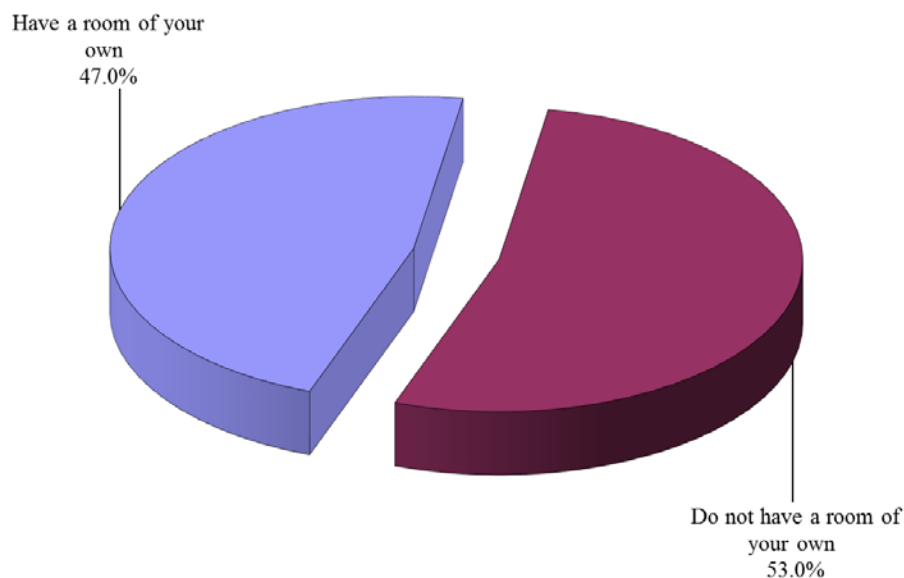
57.2% of the respondents live in New Territories. The districts with most respondents living in are Sha Tin and Kwun Tong (10.5%). The average travelling time between home and campus (including return journey) for all respondents is 92.3 minutes.

Type of Residence



54.8% of the respondents live in Government housing (Government Public Housing Estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 64.4% of their residence are of size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft..

Study Place at Home



Only 47% of the respondents have their own room.
