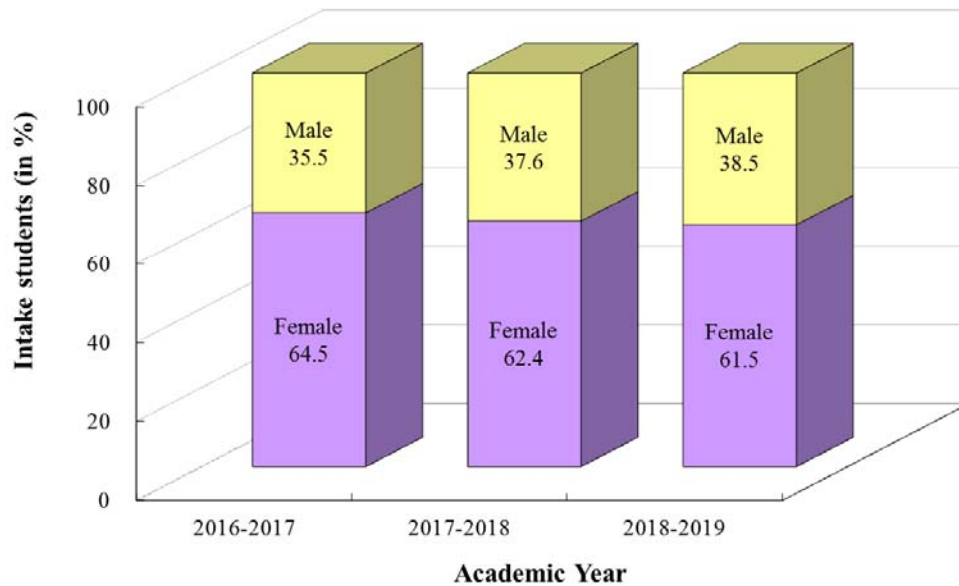


New Student Survey in Capsule 2018-2019

This survey is conducted when local first-degree intake students activate their single-sign-on account. A total of 1,937 students responded to the survey in this year, representing a response rate of 99.6% (1,937 out of 1,945), while that of last year was 99.7%.

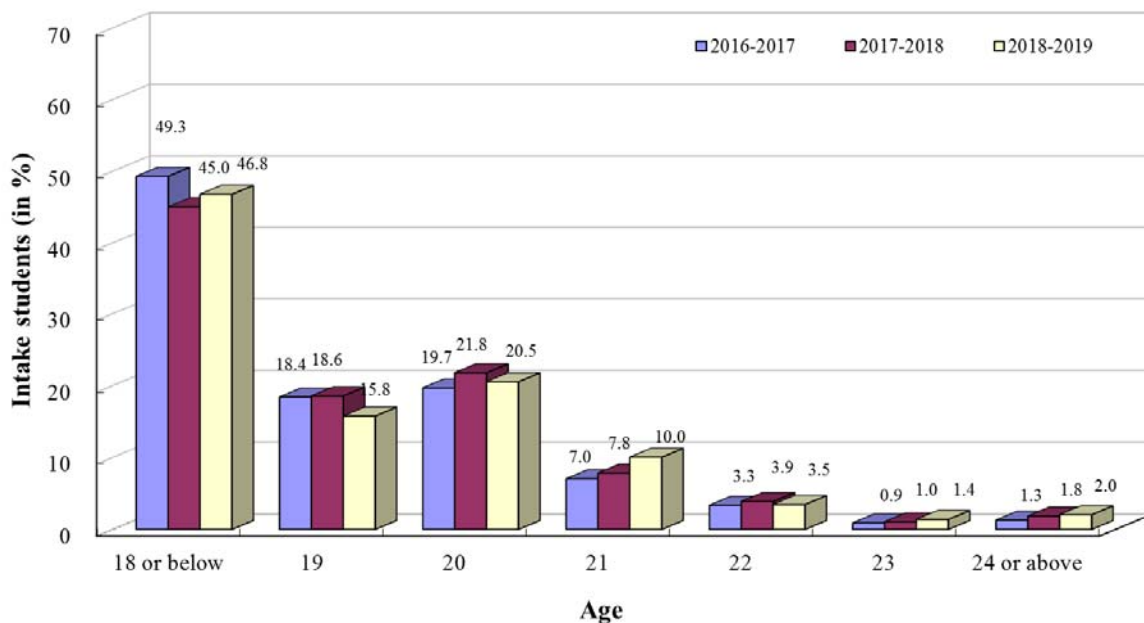
The following is the profile of all first-degree intake students for 2018-19.

Sex Profile



Like the past few years, the 2018-19 cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.60 (1:1.66 in 2017-18).

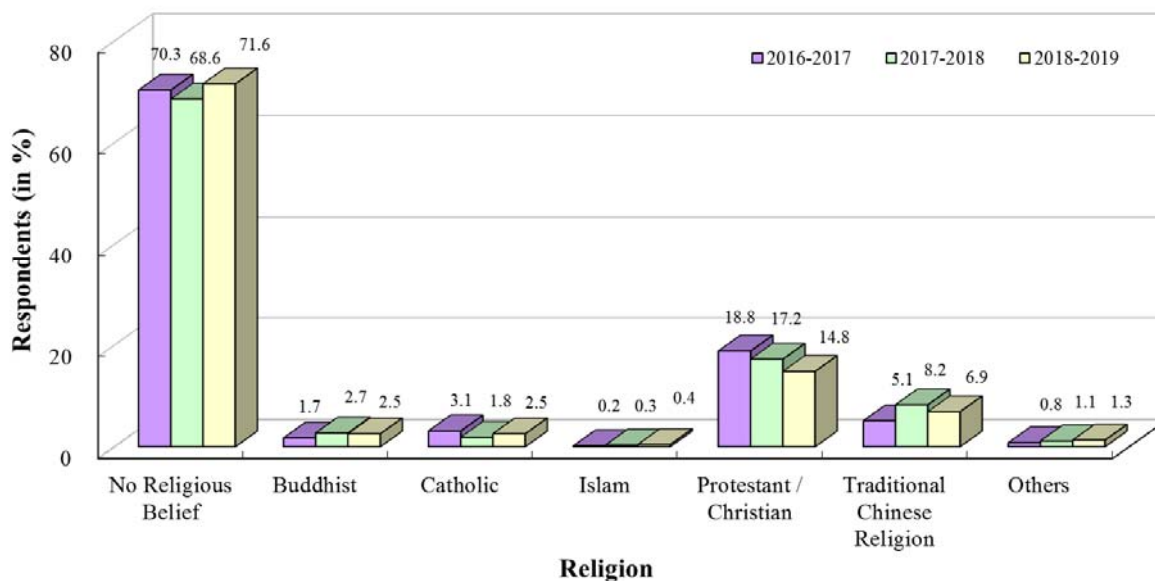
Age Profile



The percentage of 2018-19 cohort with age 20 or below is 83.1% (85.4% in 2017-18).

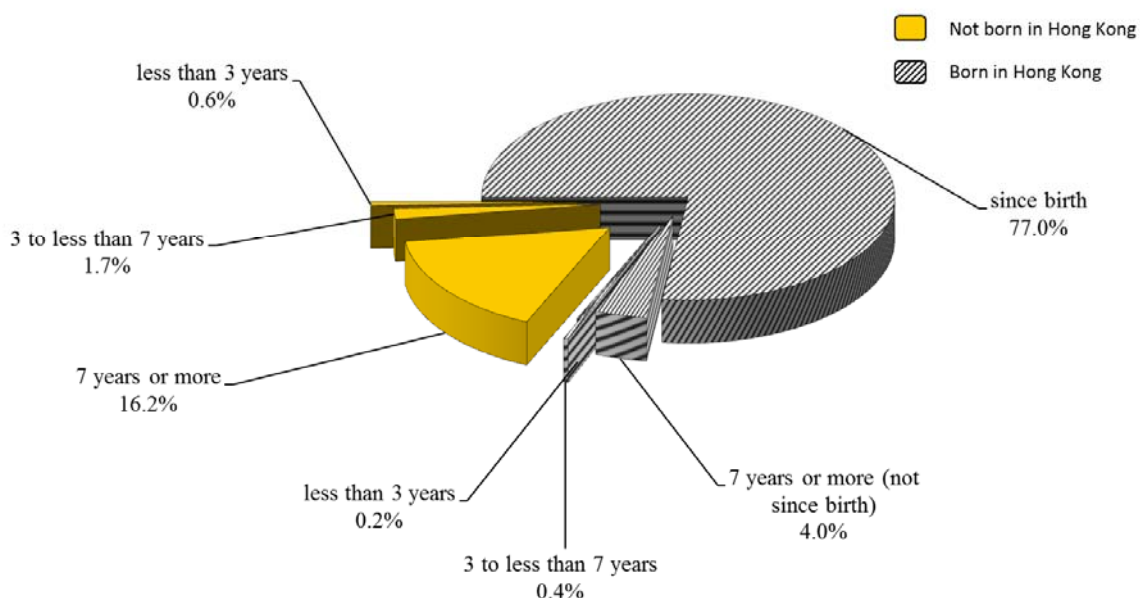
Below is the summary of the data collected from the survey on local first-degree intake students.

Religion Status



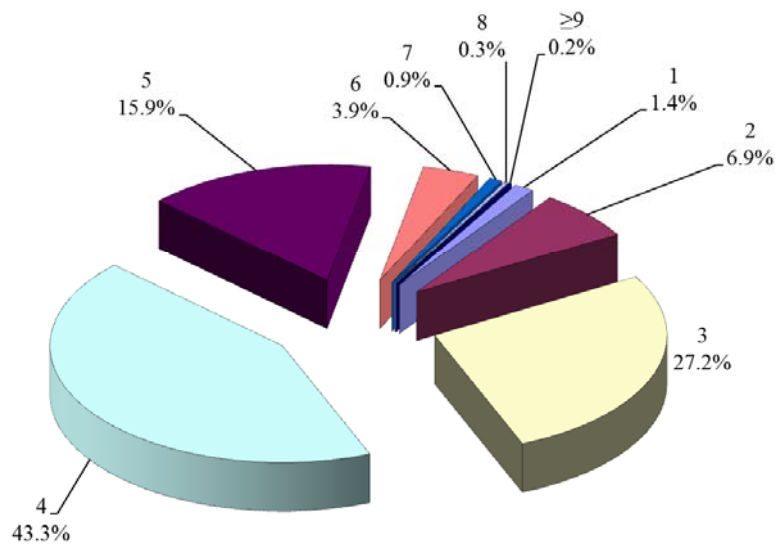
71.6% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, the majority are Protestant / Christian (14.8%).

Years of Residence in Hong Kong



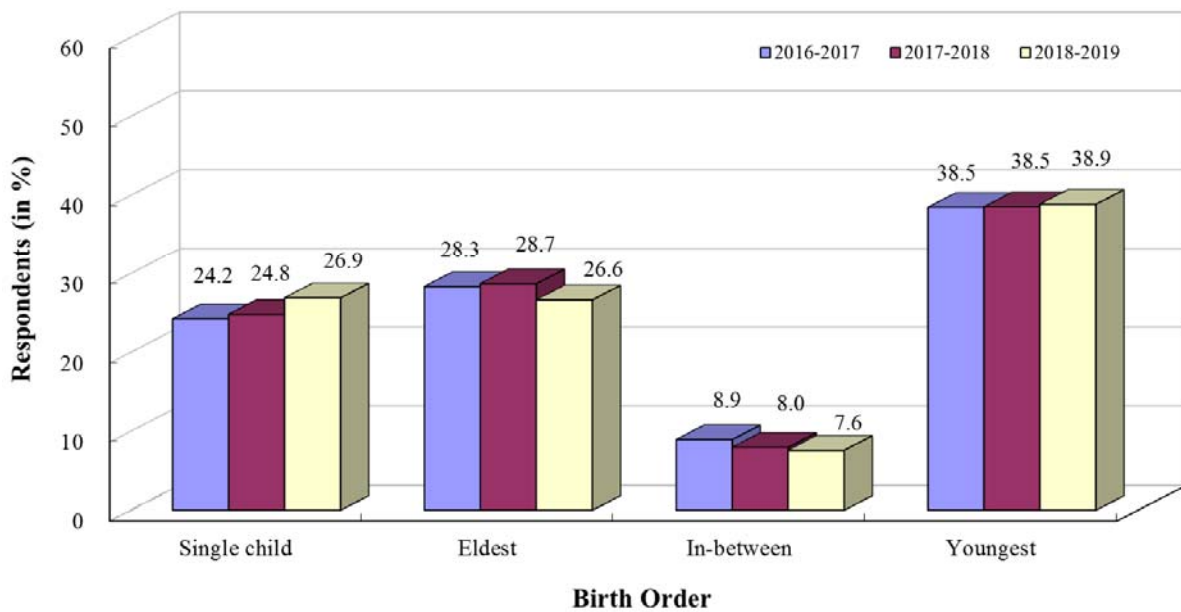
An overwhelming majority (81.6%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Only 2.8% of the respondents have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

Number of Family Members



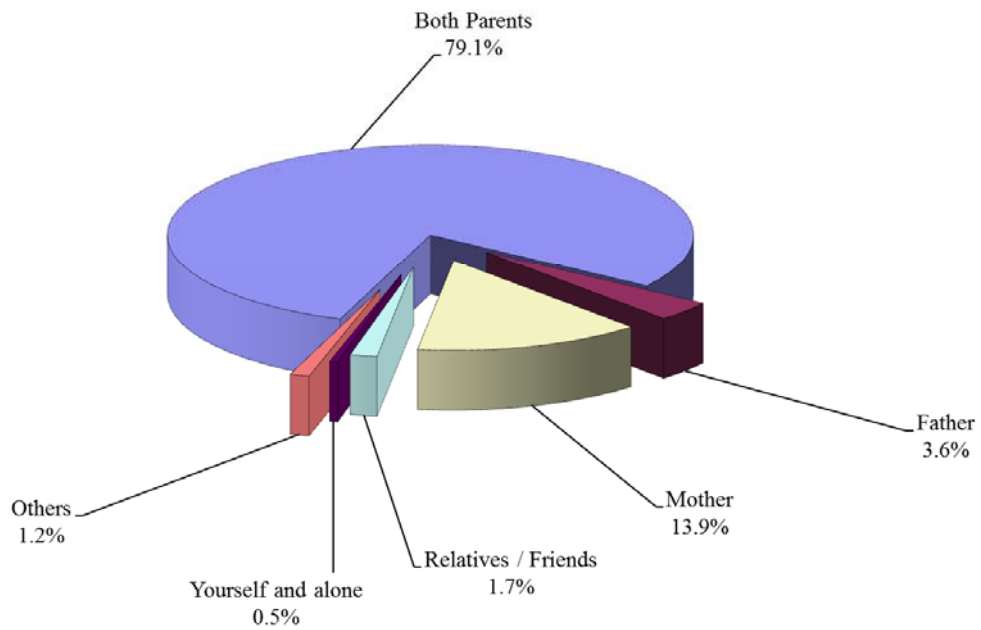
86.4% of the respondents come from a family with three to five members.

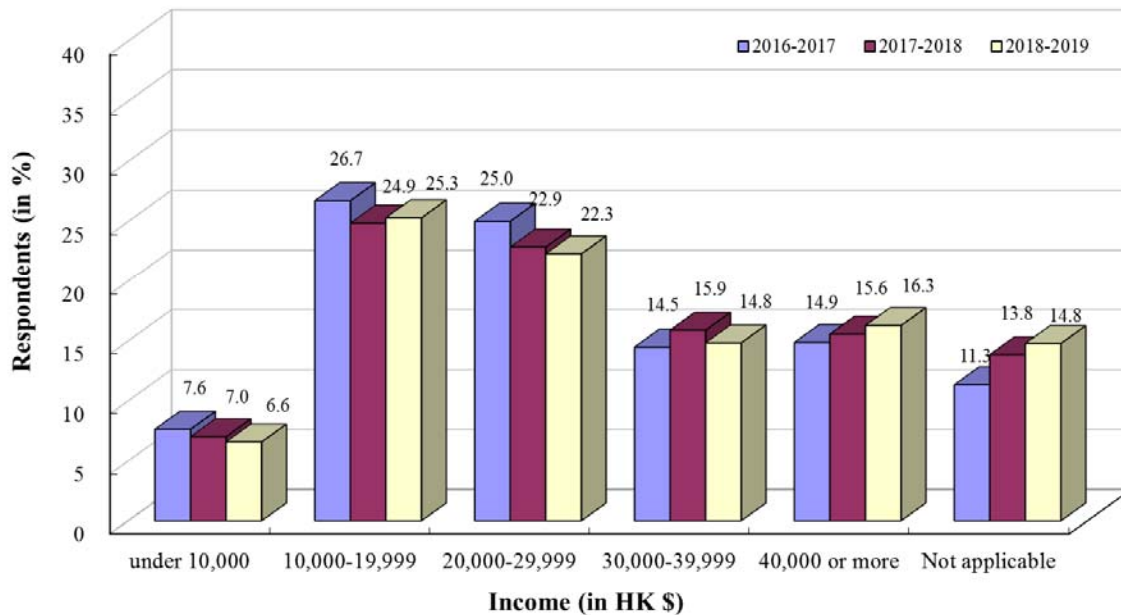
Only 19.8% of fathers and 15.7% of mothers have attained post-secondary / university education.

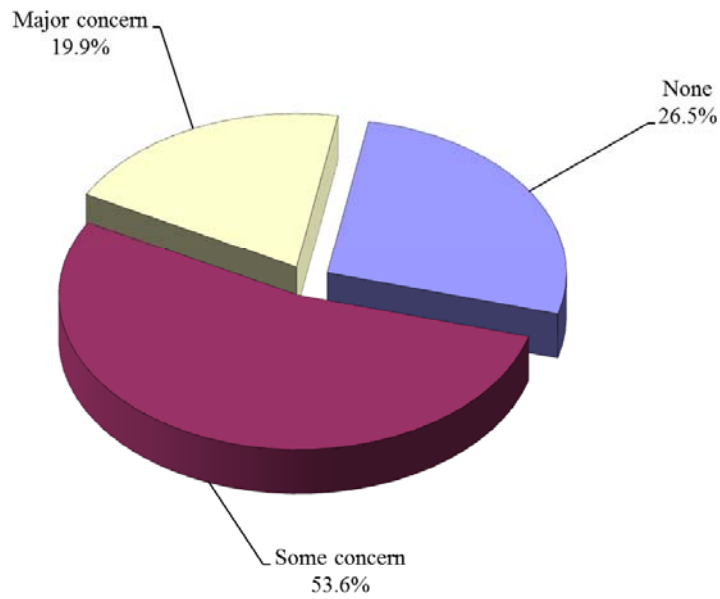
Most of the fathers are skilled / semi-skilled workers (20.8%) or work in the service sector (19.2%) while 28.4% of the mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeepers. 9.2% of the fathers and 4.3% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.

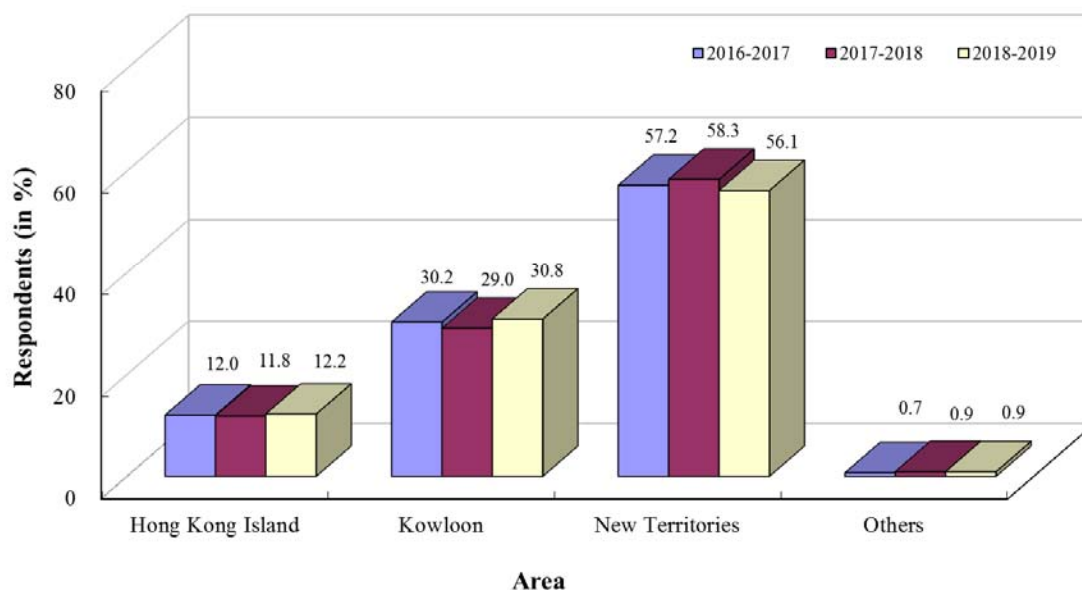

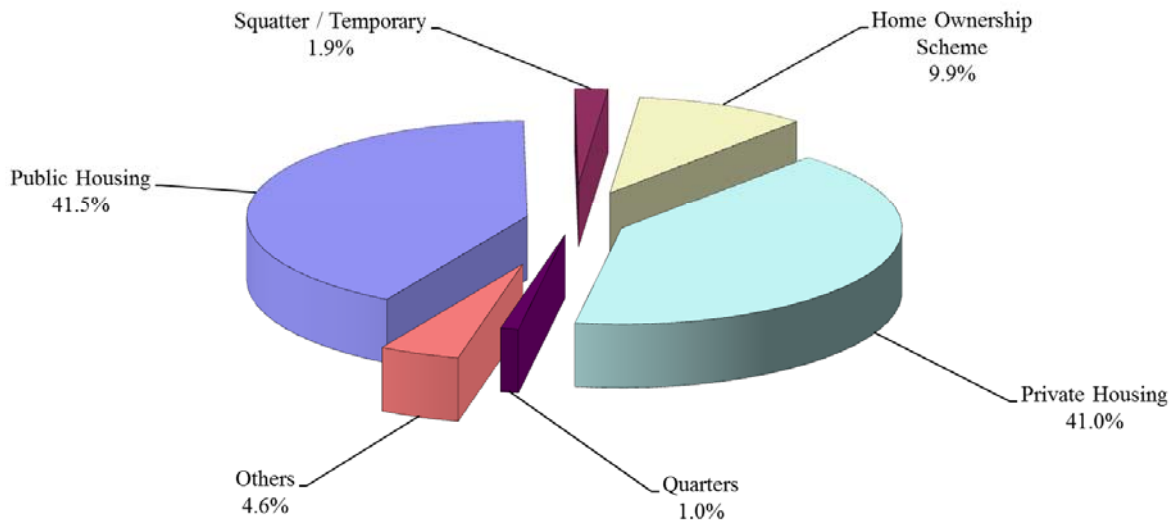

Area of Residence



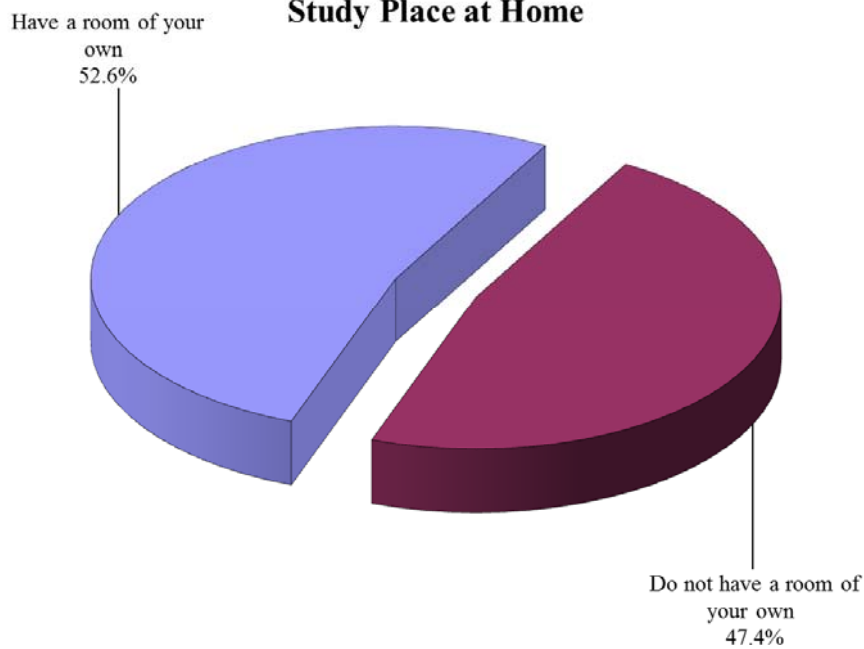
56.1% of the respondents live in New Territories. The districts with most respondents living in are Kwun Tong (11.3%), Yuen Long (9.7%) and Sai Kung (8.6%). The average travelling time between home and campus (including return journey) for all respondents is 90.3 minutes.

Type of Residence



51.4% of the respondents live in Government housing (Government Public Housing Estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 63.0% of their residence are of size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft..
