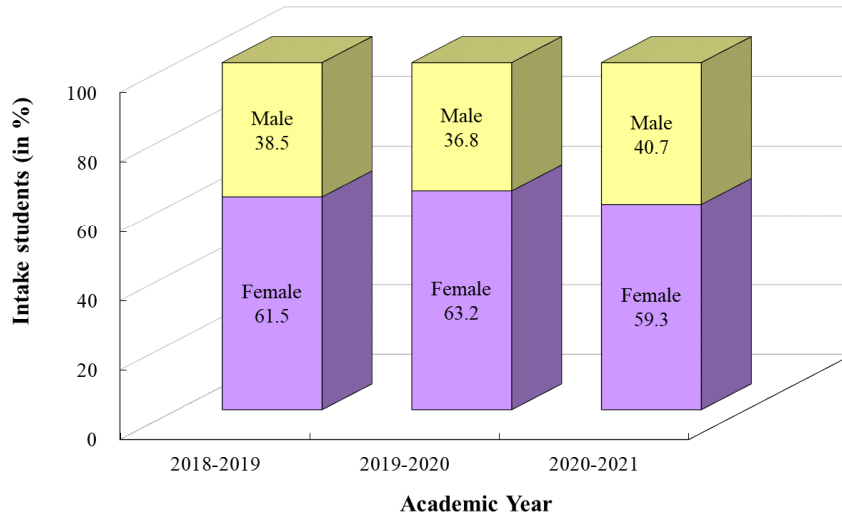


New Student Survey in Capsule 2020-2021

This survey is conducted when local first-degree intake students activate their single-sign-on account. A total of 1,898 students responded to the survey in this year, representing a response rate of 99.8% (1,898 out of 1,902), while that of last year was 99.7%.

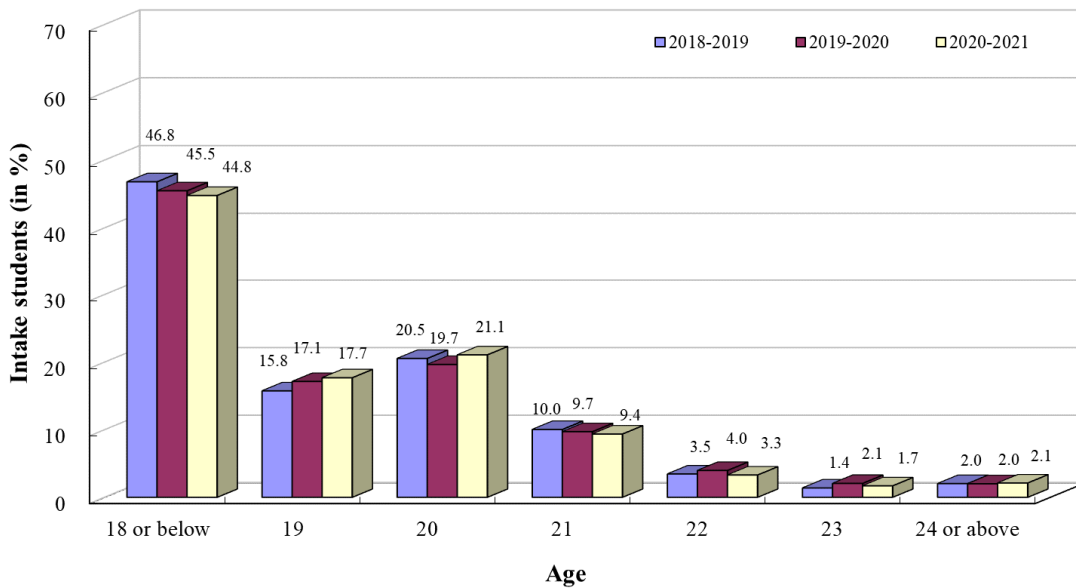
The following is the profile of all first-degree intake students for 2020-21.

Sex Profile



Like the past few years, the 2020-21 cohort has more female than male. The ratio of male to female is 1:1.46 (1:1.72 in 2019-20).

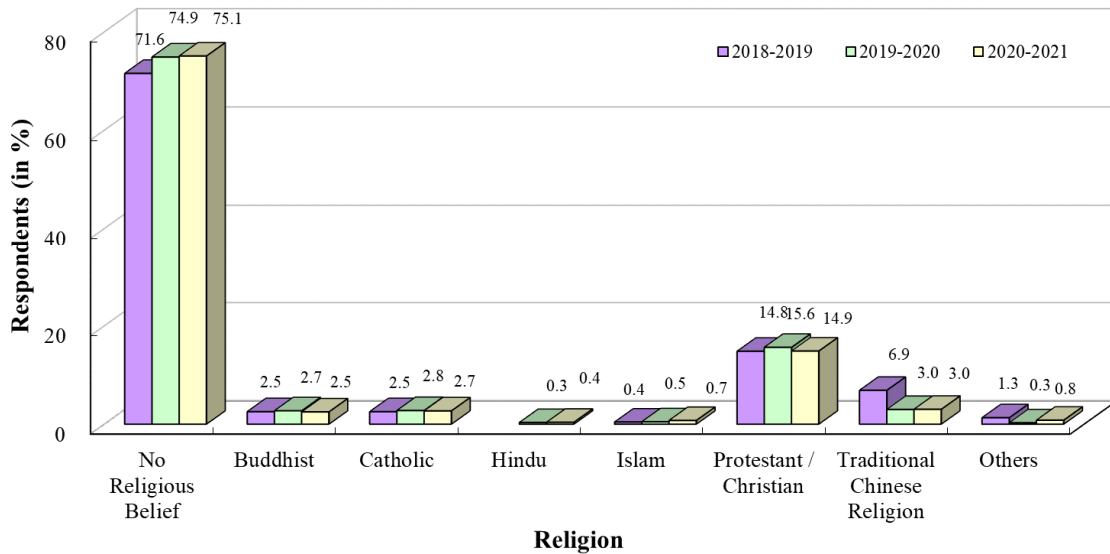
Age Profile



The percentage of 2020-21 cohort with age 20 or below is 83.5% (82.3% in 2019-20).

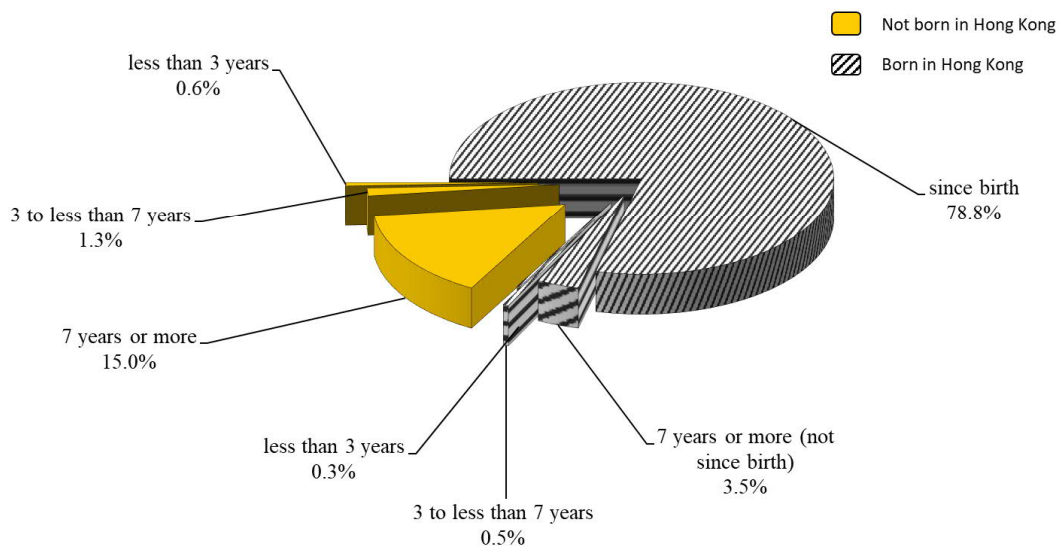
Below is the summary of the data collected from the survey on local first-degree intake students.

Religion Status



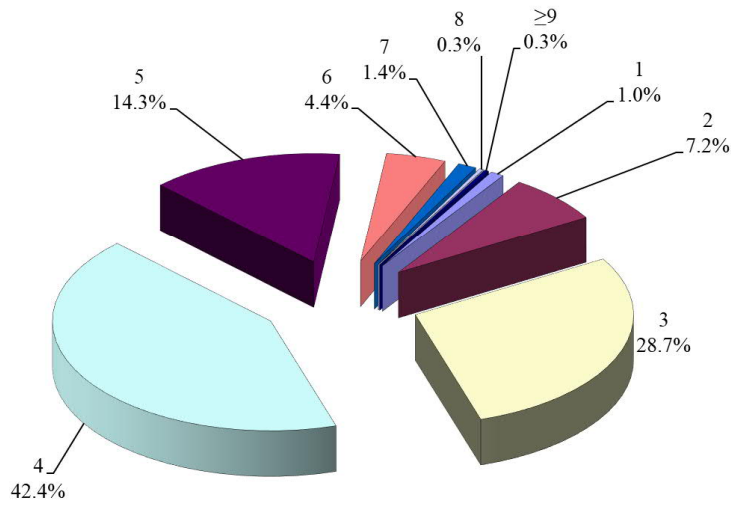
75.1% of the respondents have no religious belief. Among those who have, the majority are Protestant / Christian (14.9%).

Years of Residence in Hong Kong



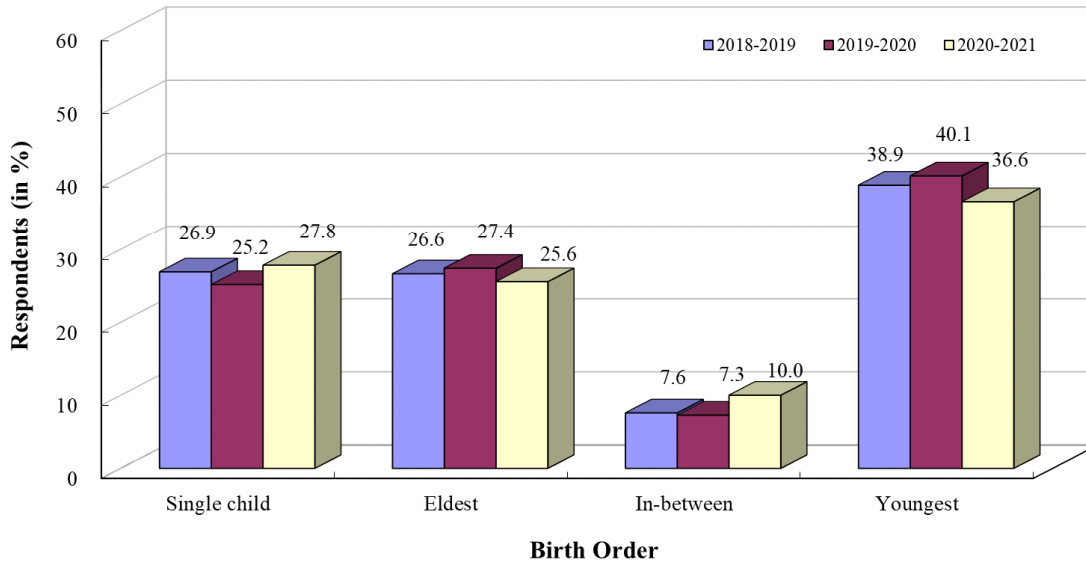
An overwhelming majority (83.1%) of the respondents were born in Hong Kong. Only 2.6% of the respondents have lived in Hong Kong for less than 7 years.

Number of Family Members



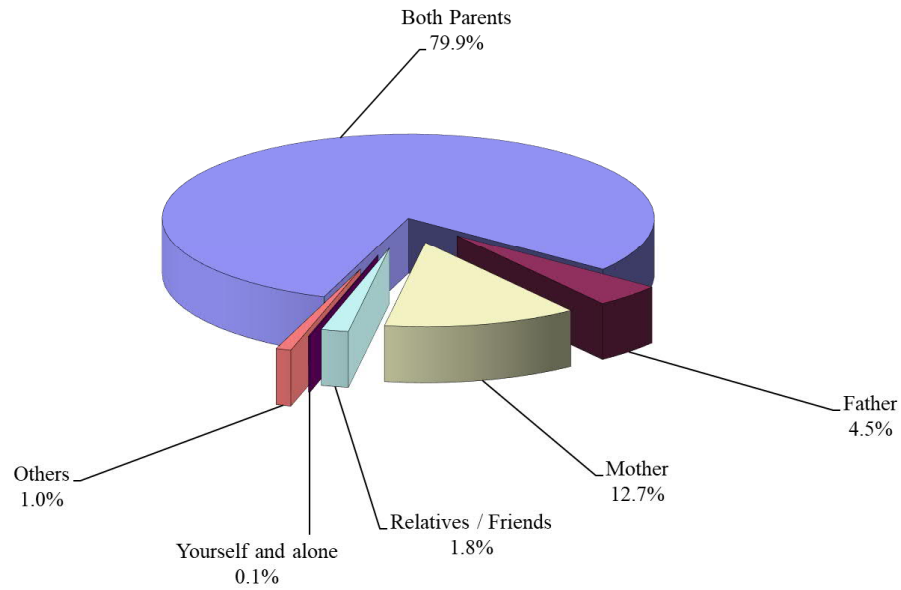
85.4% of the respondents come from a family with three to five members.

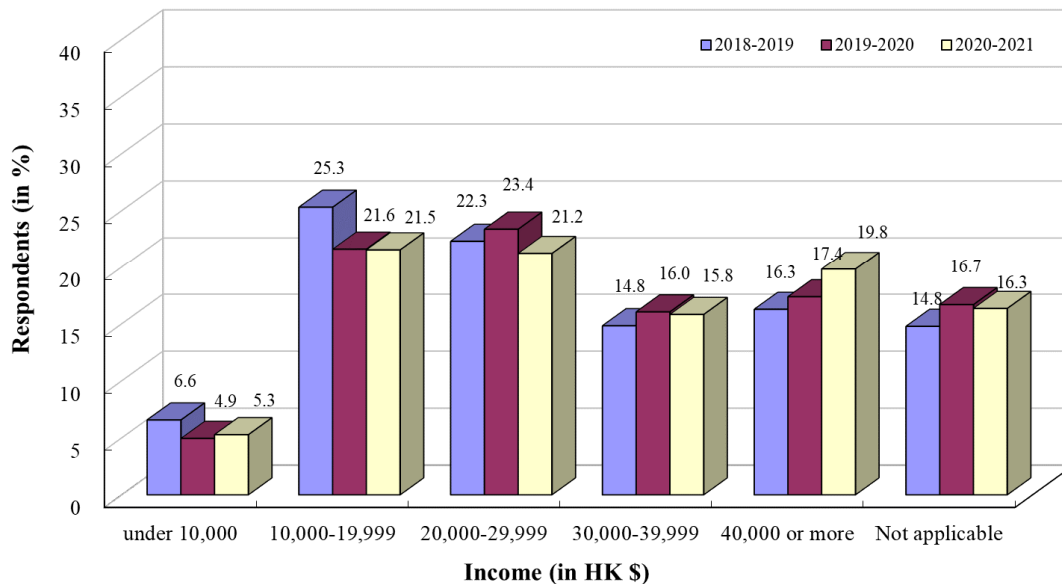
Only 20.7% of fathers and 18.2% of mothers have attained post-secondary / university education.

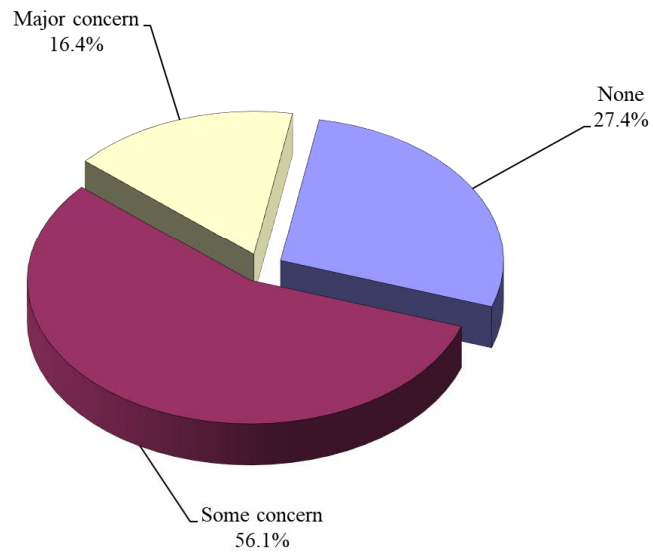
Most of the fathers are skilled / semi-skilled workers (19.6%) or work in the service sector (19.4%) while 27.4% of the mothers are either retired, unemployed or housekeepers. 9.2% of the fathers and 3.9% of the mothers are business proprietors or shop owners.

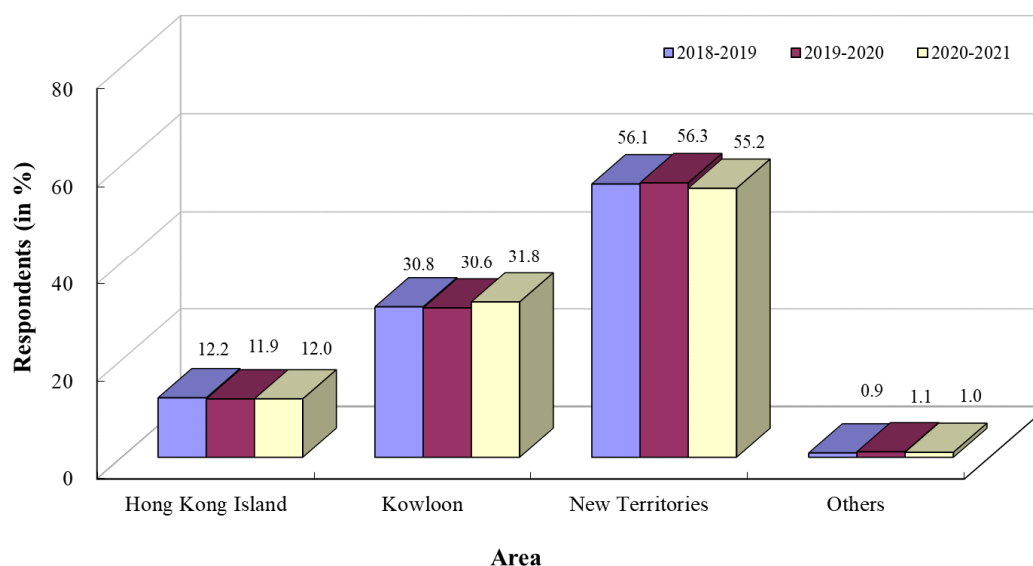

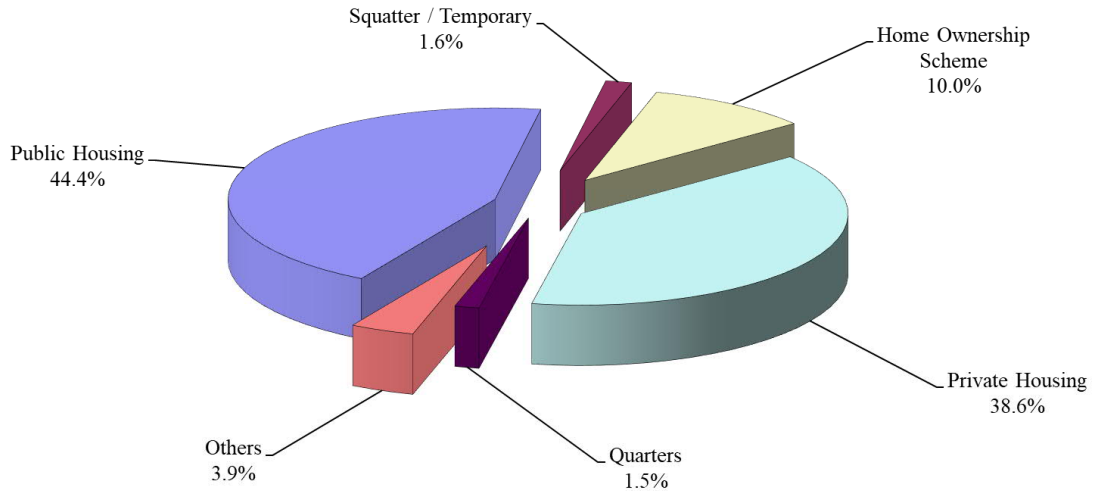

Area of Residence



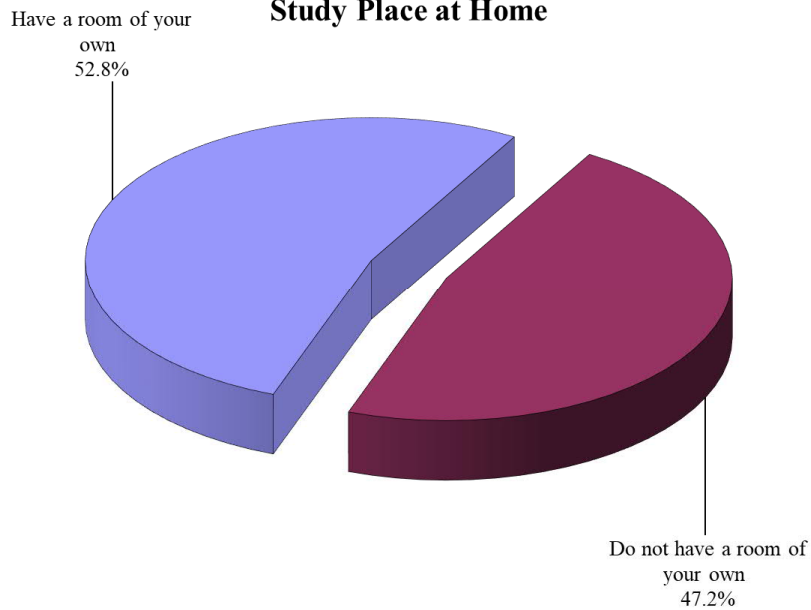
55.2% of the respondents live in New Territories. The districts with most respondents living in are Kwun Tong (13.3%), Yuen Long (10.0%) and Sha Tin (9.6%). The average travelling time between home and campus (including return journey) for all respondents is 91.5 minutes.

Type of Residence



54.4% of the respondents live in Government housing (Government Public Housing Estates and properties purchased through Government Home Ownership Scheme). This year, 65.7% of their residence are of size ranging from 200 to 599 sq.ft..
